## Haiti Building Project

A team is preparing to go to Haiti to construct another building to replace those that were destroyed in the earthquake in January 2010. Pastor Syd Kirkpatrick is the team leader and he will be accompanied by Bob Bormes, Drew and Zach Fields, Dan Landry, Dale Ramsey, and John Tuttle. The team will leave February 16 and return on March 1 with the exception of Drew and Zach Fields who can only stay a week.



Pastor Lesly Bertrand recently informed us that God has miraculously provided for the construction of another building next to the building that the team constructed a year ago. A humanitarian organization with headquarters in Europe came to Haiti to help train Haitian masons on how to construct buildings that will not collapse in an earthquake. An engineer from France and one from the Ivory Coast needed a construction project that they could use as a training experience for the Haitians. Pastor Lesly applied and was approved. The humanitarian organization paid all the expenses connected with this second building and even started to prepare the foundation for the third building that our team will work on next month. What a tremendous blessing! Pictured is building number two on the right beside the building constructed by our team on the left. The third building will be a two story building.

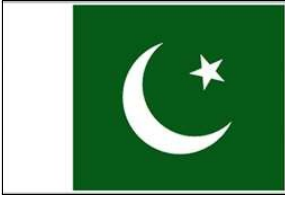


Team members are currently asking for help with expenses to go to Haiti. In addition to the plane tickets an additional \$820 is needed per person to cover meals, housing, insurance, and some assistance toward the cost of the building. Additional funds in the amount of about \$15,000 will be needed for the third building. Your help will be greatly appreciated. Below is an estimated breakdown of the supplies needed for building number three:

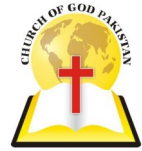
Concrete for floor - \$70 per yard – 80 yards needed  
Cement blocks – \$1.50 each – 2,000 needed  
Sheet of roofing material - \$30 each – 50 needed  
Conduit - \$5.00 for 10 feet - 30 sections needed  
Other electrical supplies - \$8.00 each unit - 20 units needed

We are thankful for the team members who use vacation time and some of their own funds to participate in this and other mission trips. And thanks to all who have already helped with construction costs.

## Pakistan Report



Pastor Werner Bartl, from Austria, has joined us in providing financial support for the family of slain Pastor Rashid Emmanuel. We have been sending \$375 per month to help with the alternate living expenses needed for the family and also to help with attorney fees and court costs. Contributions for the Emmanuel Memorial fund have declined and the fund is now depleted. Pastor Bartl and his contacts in Europe have sent some funds to assist with this need. LHI, with your help, continues to send \$520 per month which is divided among the 10 churches to help with their operating expenses. We also send \$150 per month to help purchase Bibles.
